In the seafood industry in Santa Rosalia, Baja California Sur, Mexico, human rights violations are the norm:

- Women and Children work 14-16 hours a day, up to 7 days a week
- Workers trying to unionize are unfairly terminated
- Decrease to workers wages
- Workers are paid 1.5 (US) cents for each pound of squid they clean

International Corporations from China, Korea and the U.S. control the fishing industry in Santa Rosalia

Workers are organizing for justice in the seafood industry in Santa Rosalia, BCS, Mexico. Hanjin, a transnational company, owns and operates a seafood processing plant in Santa Rosalia. It makes profits from its squid products sold in the U.S., Asia and Europe, while paying miserable prices to the fisherman who catch the squid and the women employed in the processing plant work under inhumane conditions

On Wednesday July 8th Seafood Workers in Santa Rosalia will be organizing an action against the maquiladora Hanjin. In Los Angeles, we will be having a picket against Korean grocery stores who continue to sell products distributed by Hanjin.
